




SUMMER INTENSIVE COURSE



This course is intended for those who wish to study during the summer holidays. It is an intensive class that meets 4 lessons per day, 20 lessons per week. In addition to regular classes, there will also be extra-curricular activities that offer students opportunities to experience Japanese culture.

Please note that this course does not meet the qualifications for Japanese language "College Student" visa status. Those coming to Japan from abroad in order to enroll in this class should enter the country with a "Temporary Visitor" or similar visa.

Term	July 13 - August 7, 2015 (4 weeks) *Although July 20 is a national holiday, classes will be held as usual.
Classes	Beginner (3 levels), Intermediate (2 levels), Advanced *Student's class level depends upon the result of placement test.
Class Days	Monday - Friday
Class Hours	9:00 a.m. - 12:30 p.m. (45 min×4)
Registration Fee	¥10,800 (¥11,000 including tax at a rate of 10%)
Tuition Fee	¥76,600 (¥78,100 including tax at a rate of 10%) *Fees for textbooks and other materials are additional. Once paid, tuition fees shall under no circumstances be refunded.
Class Size	Limited to 13 students. No classes will be held if the enrollment is less than 5 students.
Application	Please complete the necessary items on the application form, attach a photograph, and submit it to the school office.
Application Dead line	June 19, 2015 *Please complete your application by June 1 if you need any accommodation arrangements by school.

Beginner Level

Using basic structures and words, this level aims to give you basic conversational ability. The classes concentrate mainly on speaking Hiragana, Katakana and Kanji used in everyday life are also studied.

Intermediate Level

This level consolidates the grammar learnt at the beginning level and adds to your listening and speaking ability. By also using relatively difficult texts, it will provide a comprehensive study program useful in everyday life.

Advanced Level

This is a class designed for people who are able to read more than 1000 Kanji and have a good grasp of Japanese. Newspapers and magazine articles etc are used as study materials as well as advanced texts. It will provide you with the ability to fully state your own opinions, etc.
